The Kentucky Equine Management Internship (KEMI) program offers the unique opportunity for students to be exposed to the world of Thoroughbred racing. Interns live and work on Central Kentucky horse farms for 22 weeks where they are involved in the day-to-day operation of the farm. They work directly with the horses: grooming, feeding, cleaning stalls, taking mares to the breeding sheds, foal watching, etc. Housing and an hourly wage is provided.

The spring session dates are Jan. 7 through June 6. Applications for the spring session of the KEMI are now being accepted. The deadline to apply for the spring session is Oct. 31. More information about the program and applications can be found at kemi.org.
