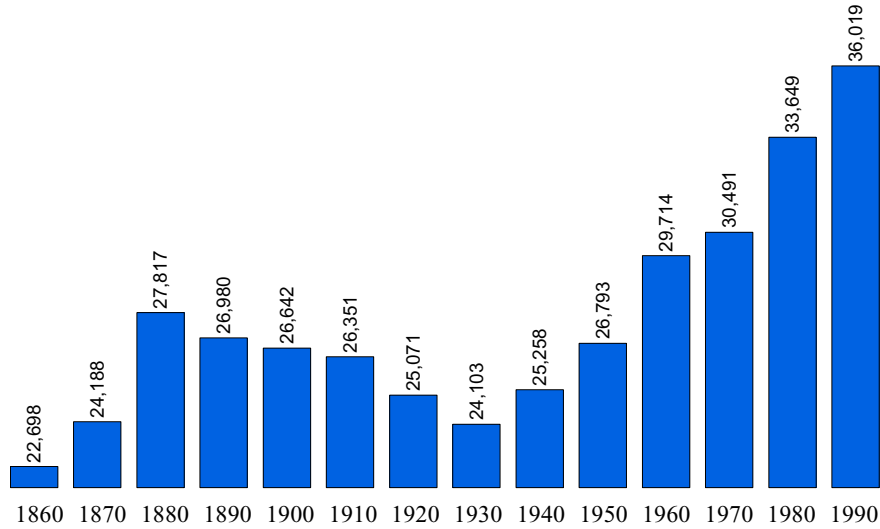




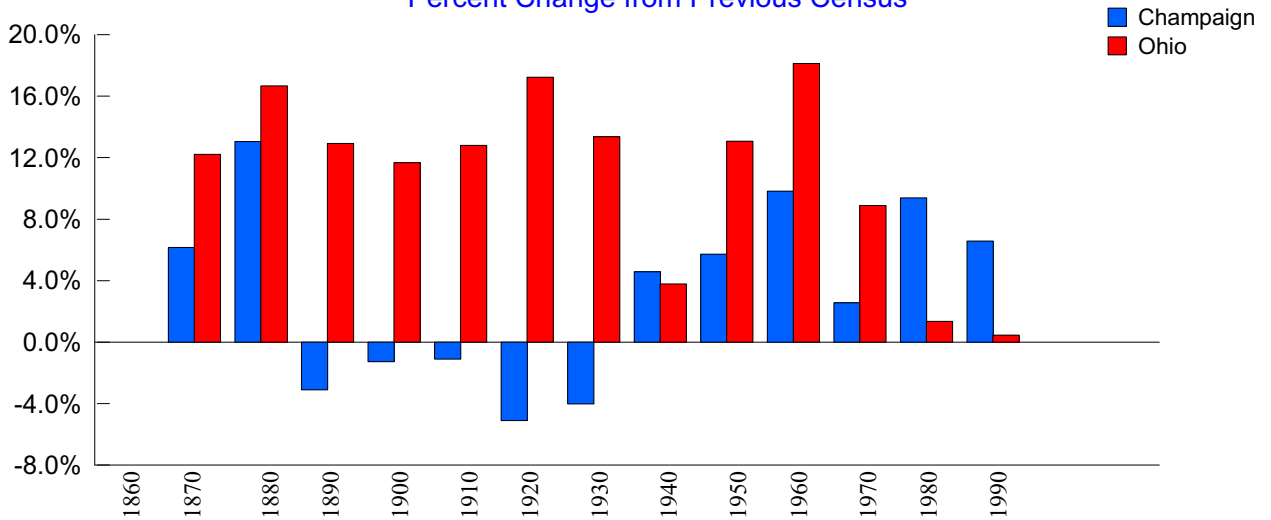

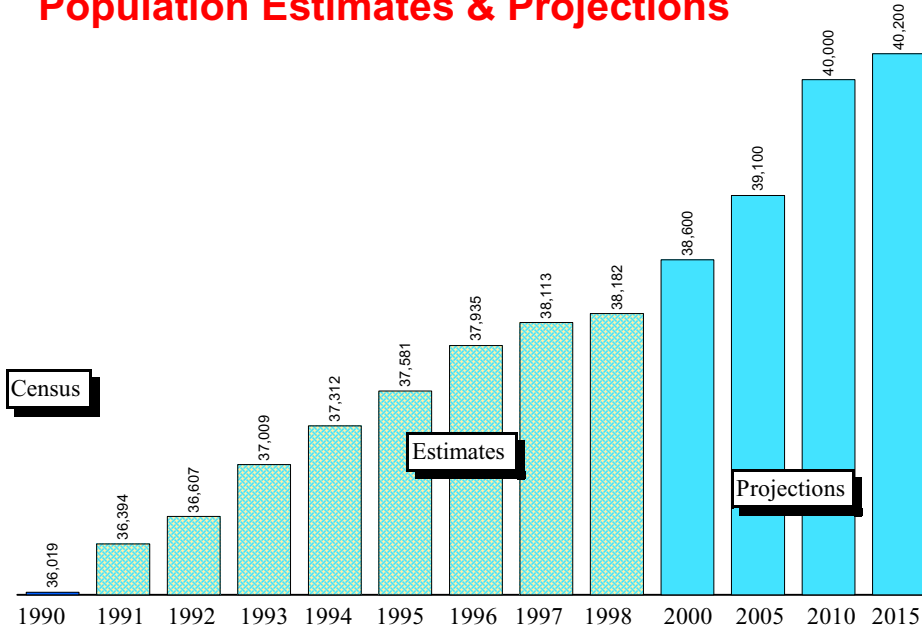
Population 1860 to 1990 Percent Change from Previous Census

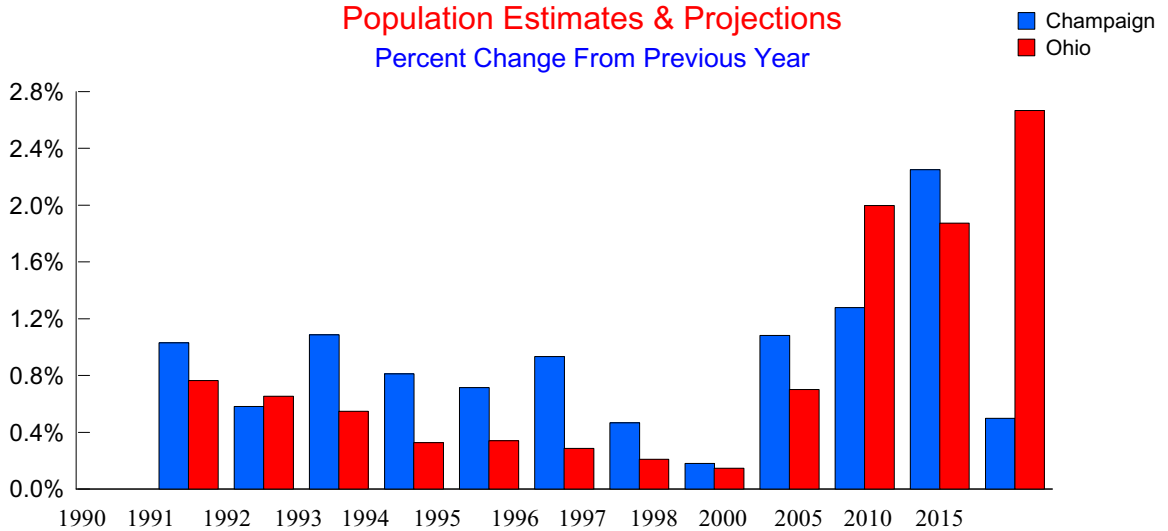

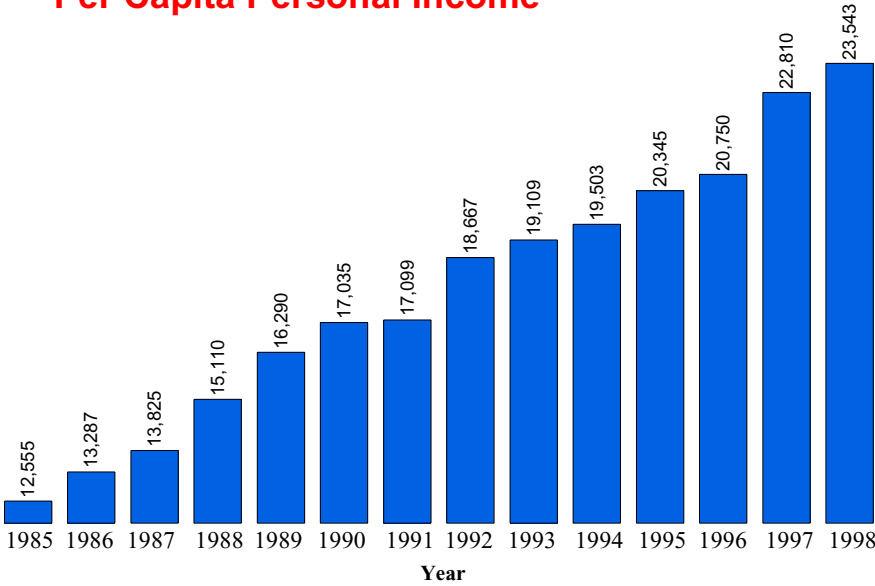

Per Capita Personal Income



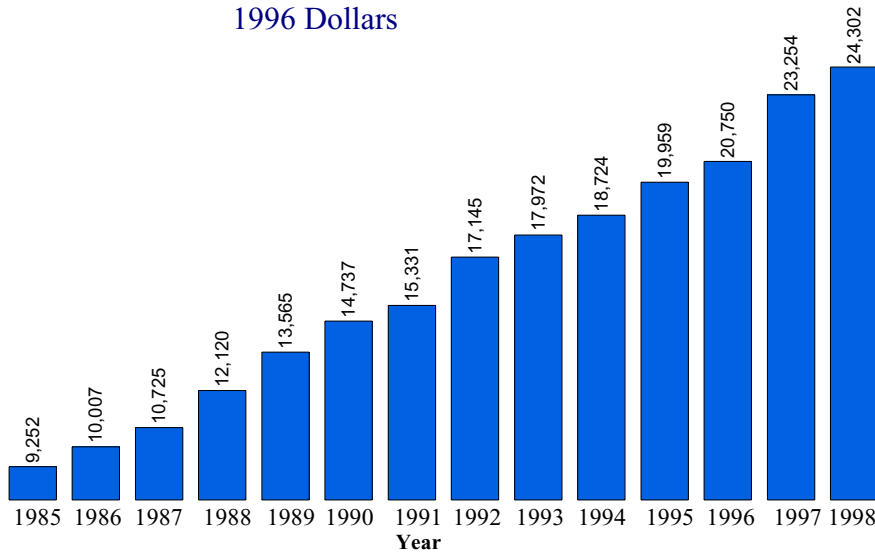
Per capita personal income is the amount of money before taxes generated on average by each person living in the county.

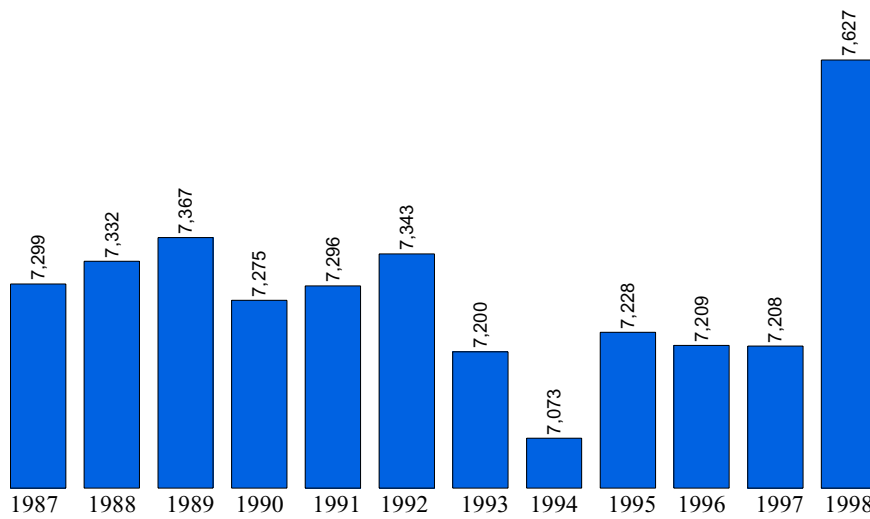

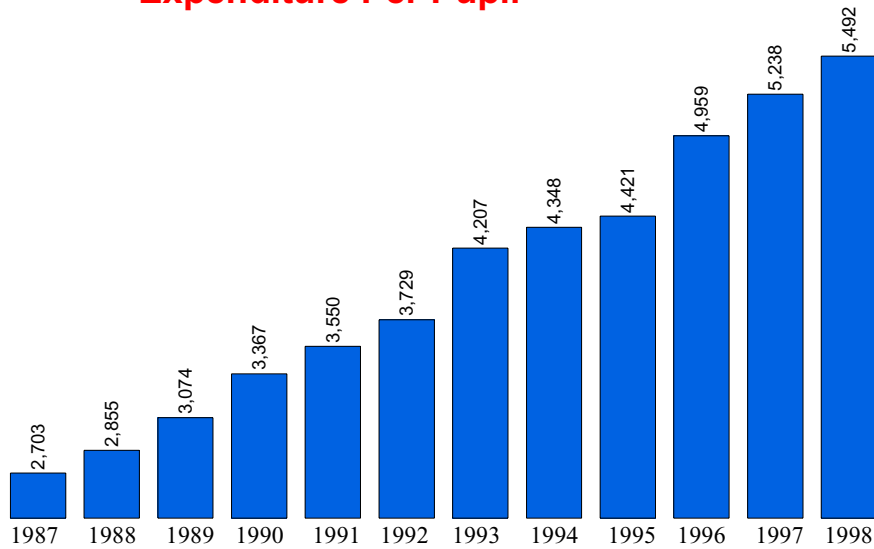

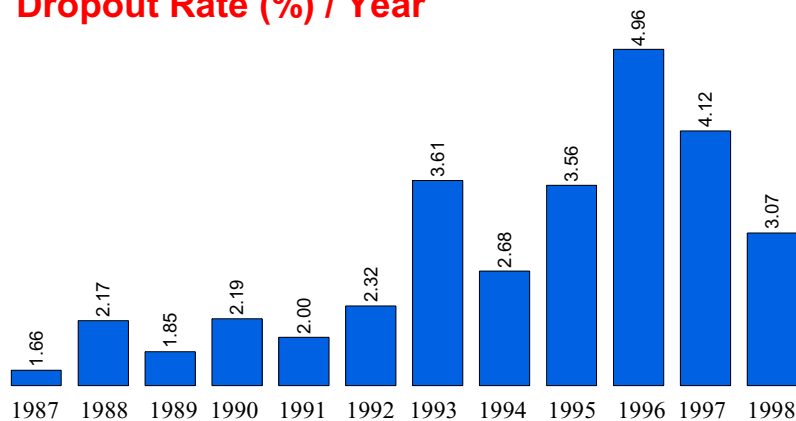


Expenditure Per Pupil

Dropout Rate (%) / Year

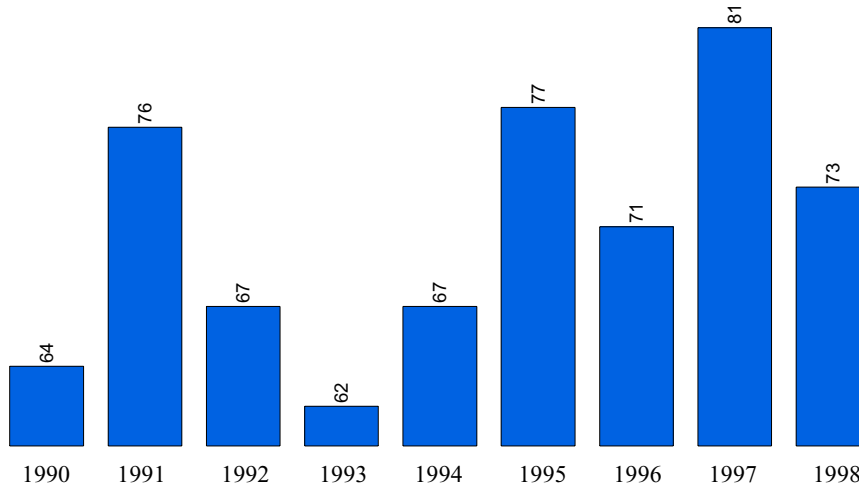

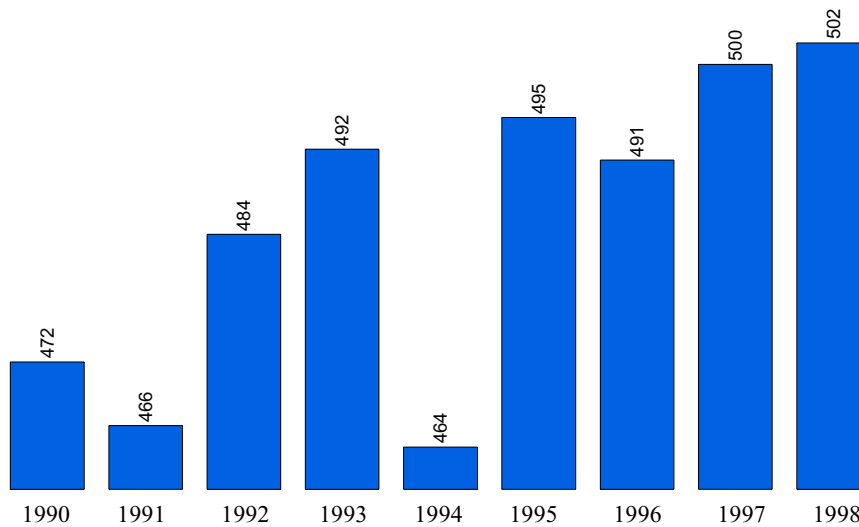

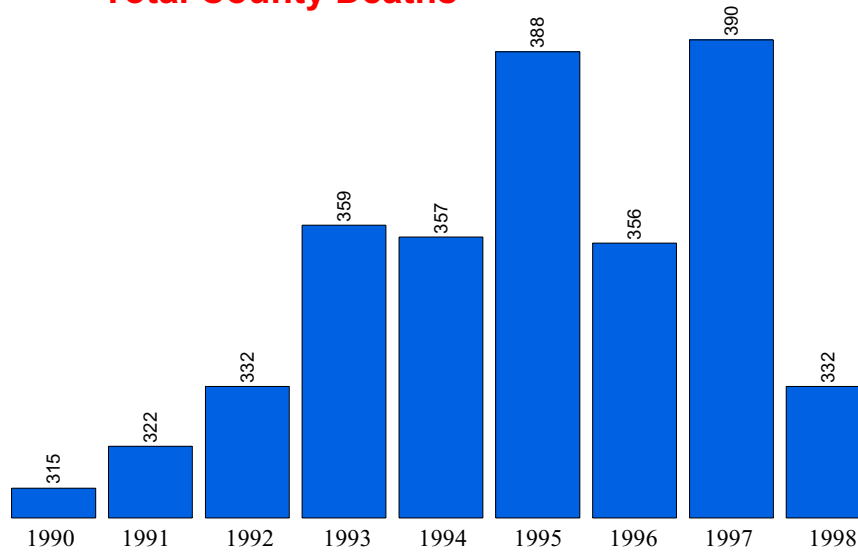
Total County Births

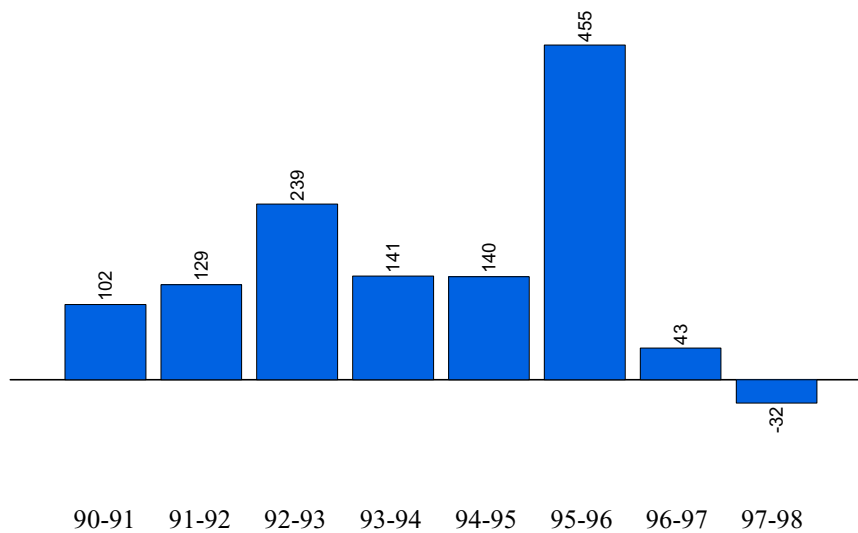


Total County Deaths
