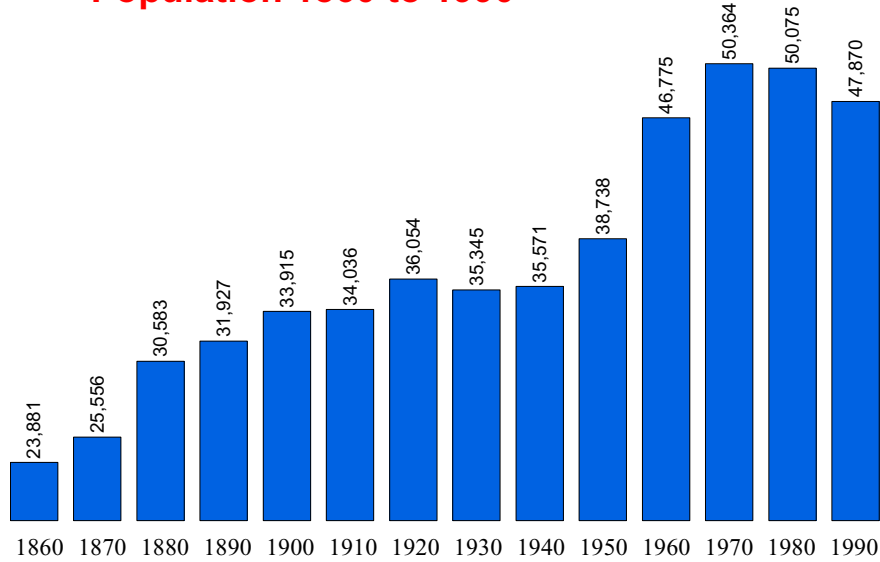

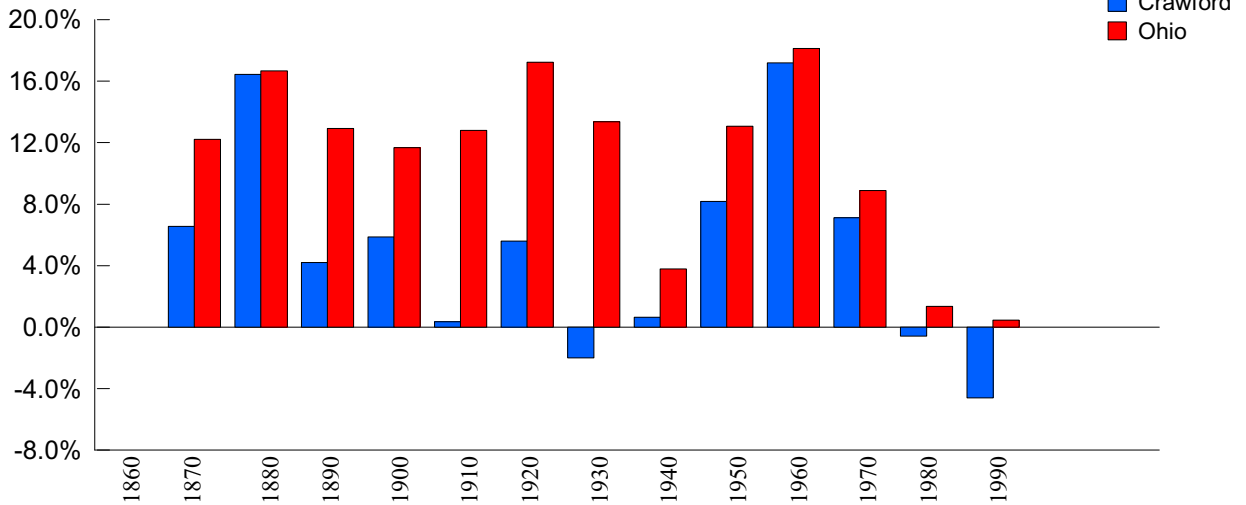
Population 1860 to 1990



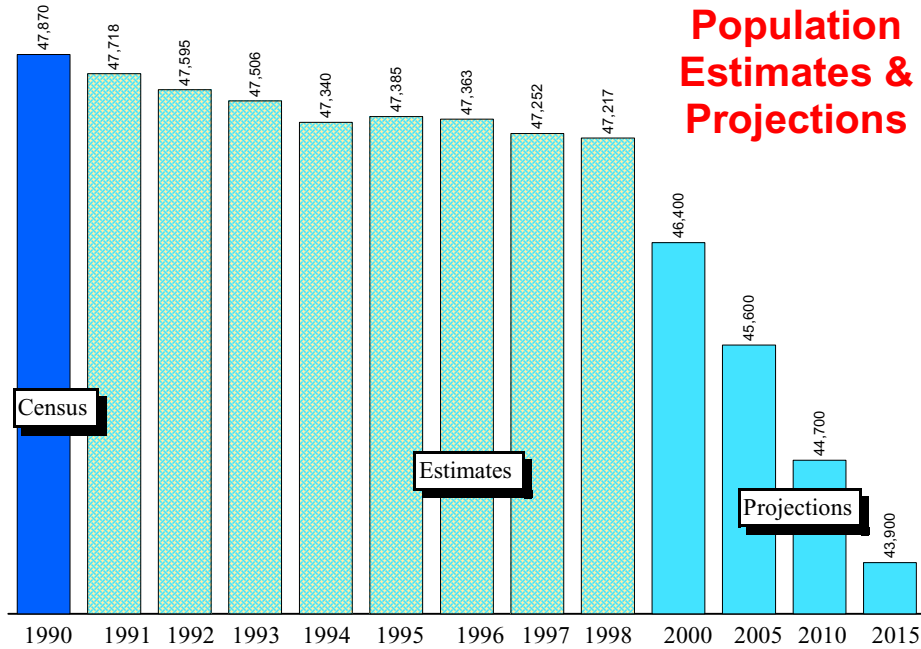

Population 1860 to 1990

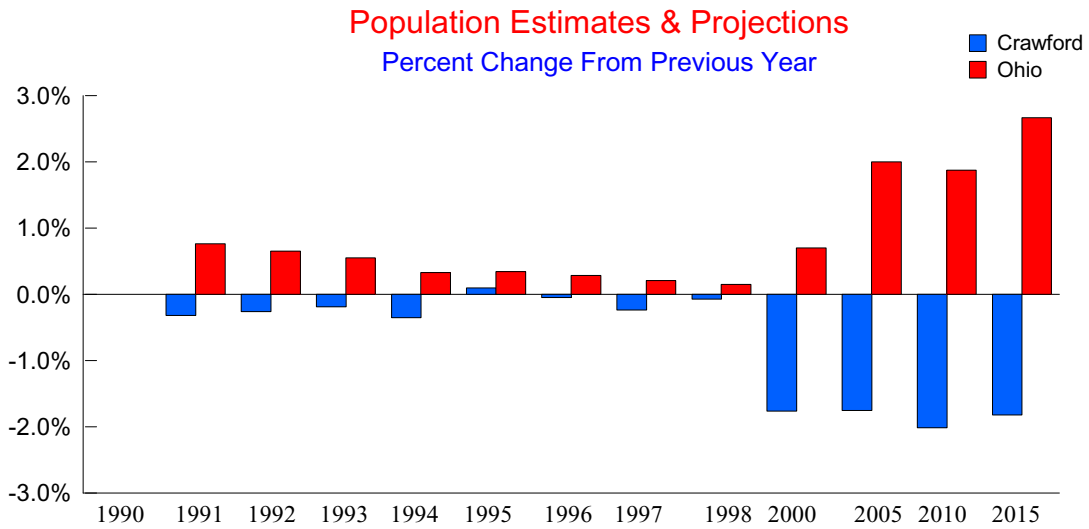
Percent Change from Previous Census

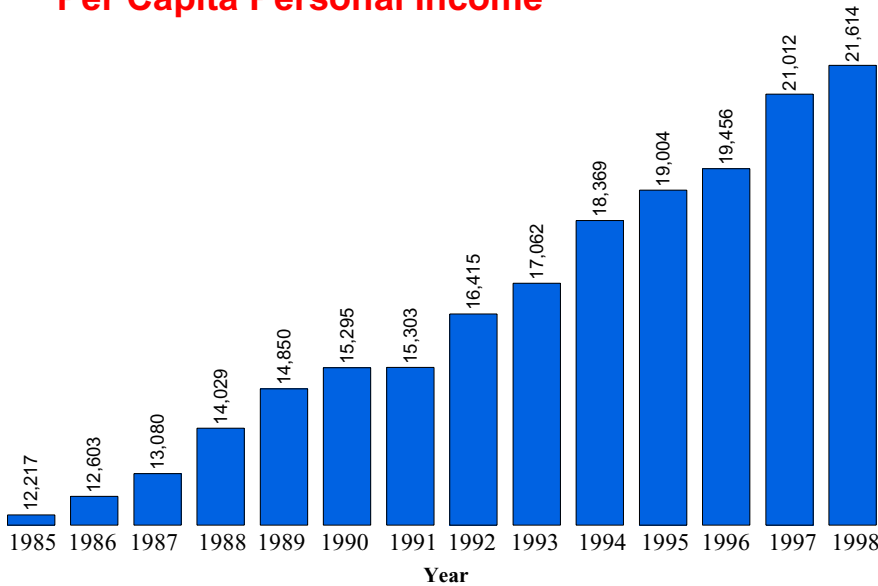

Per Capita Personal Income



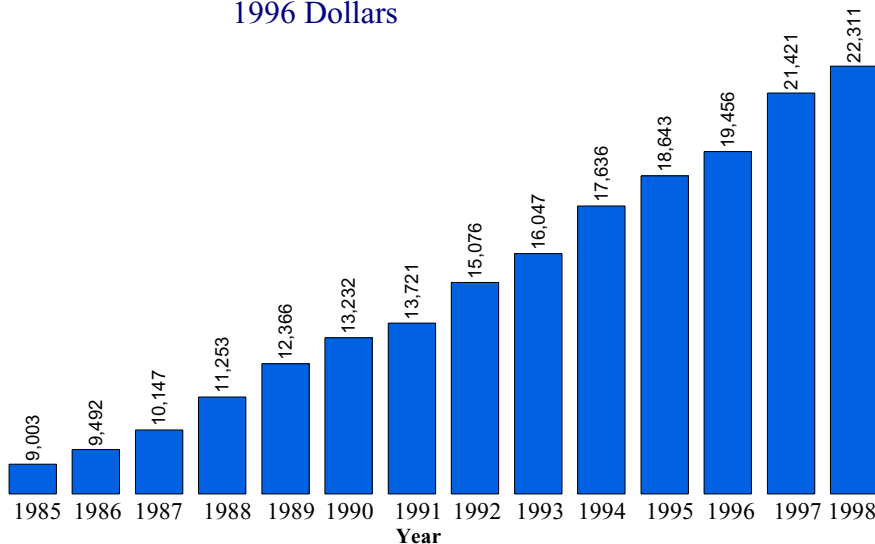
Per capita personal income is the amount of money before taxes generated on average by each person living in the county.

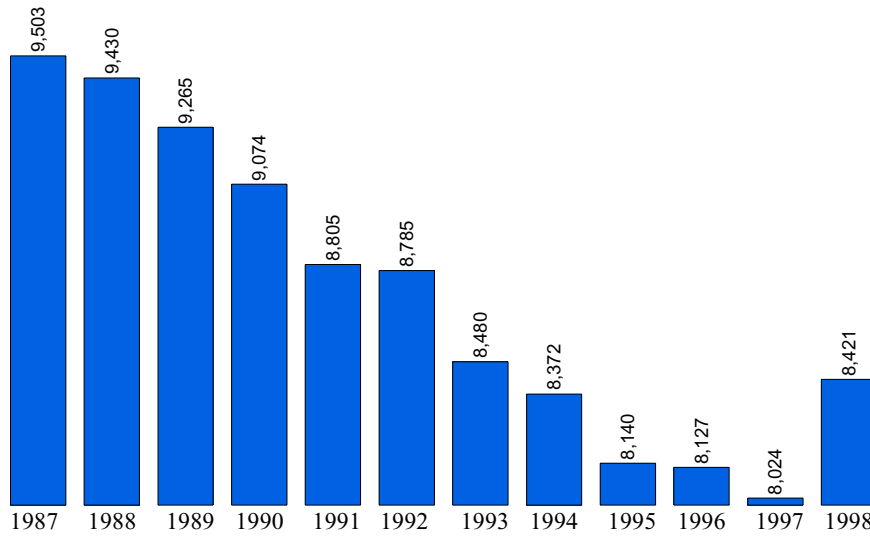

1998 Ohio Average Daily Membership = 1,846,903

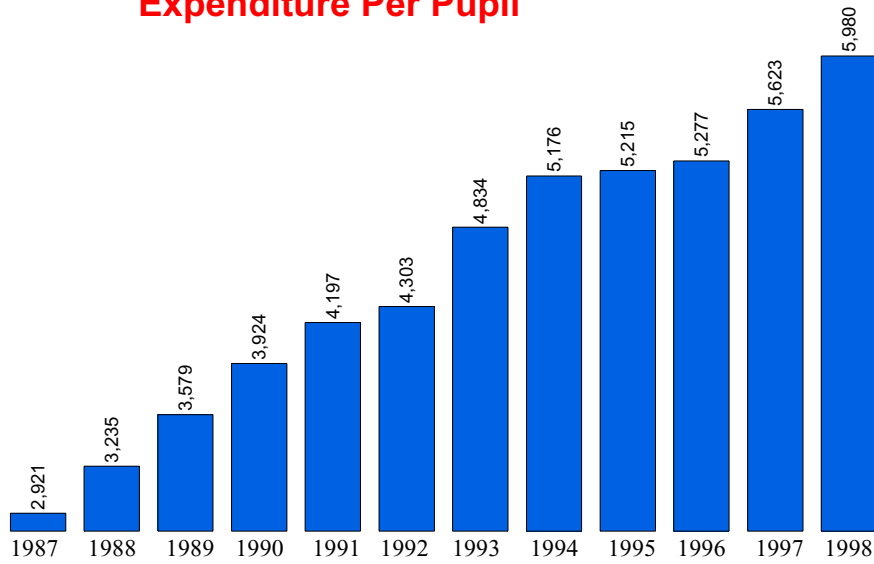

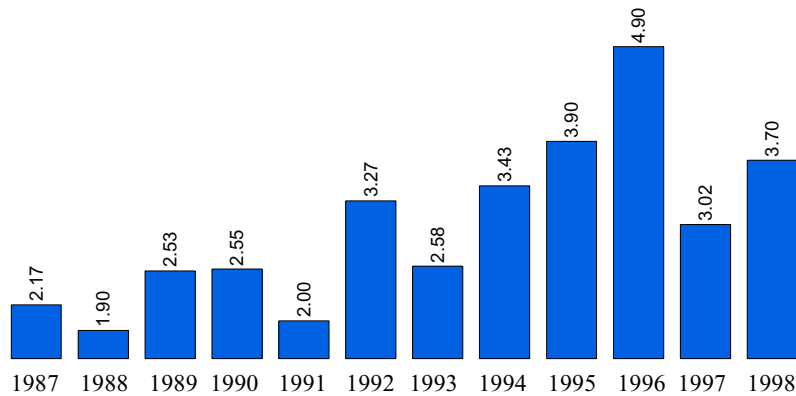

Dropout Rate (%) / Year

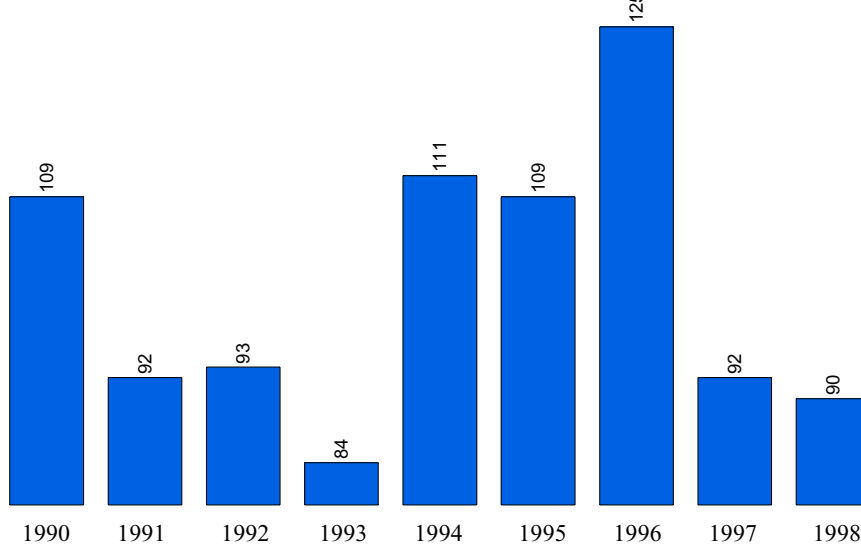

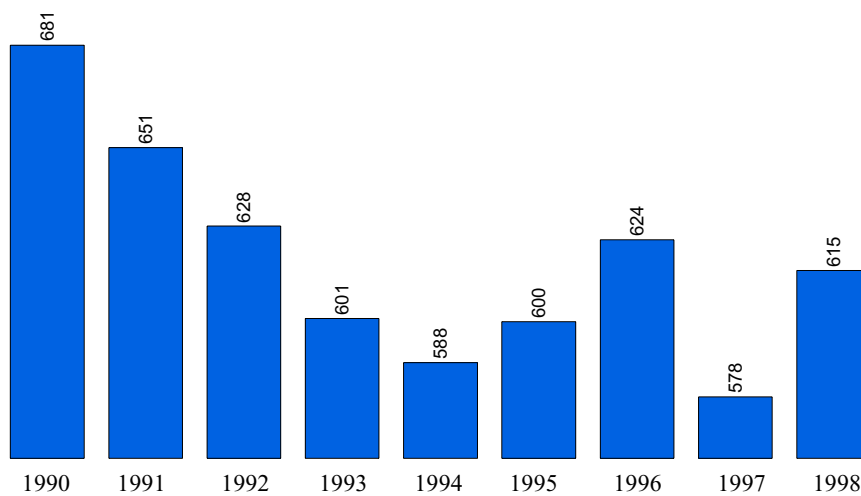

Births to Mothers 19 and Under



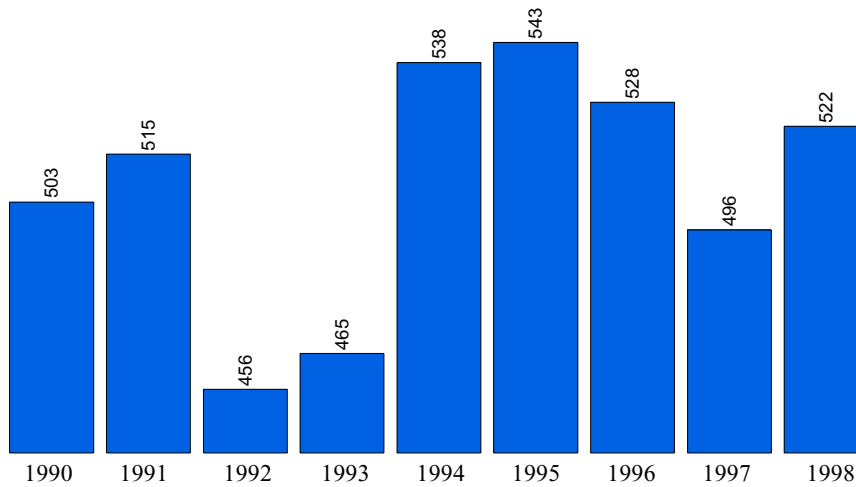

Total County Births



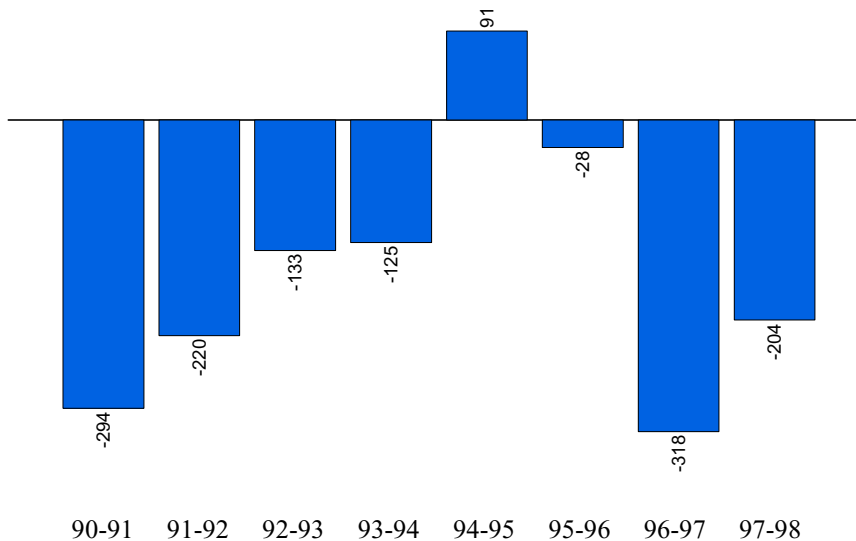
