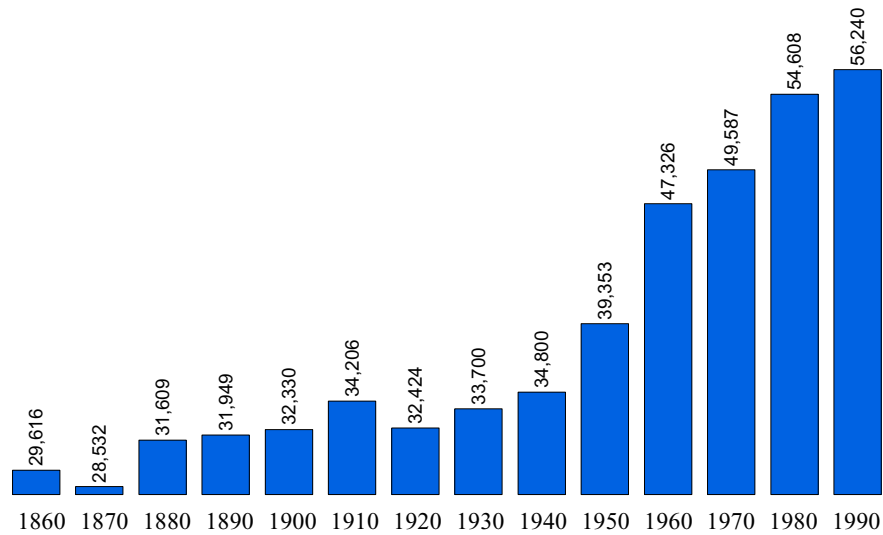




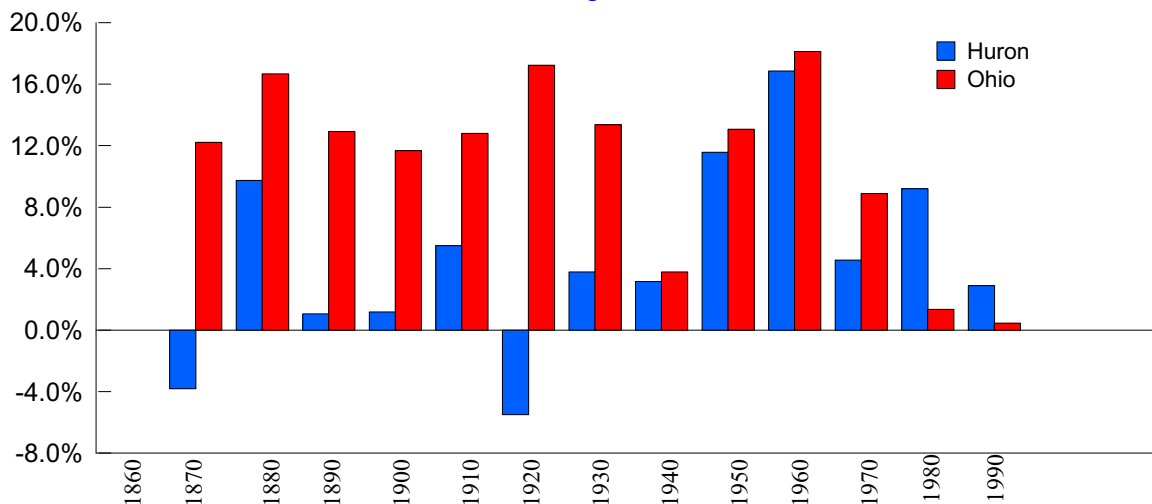

### Population 1860 to 1990



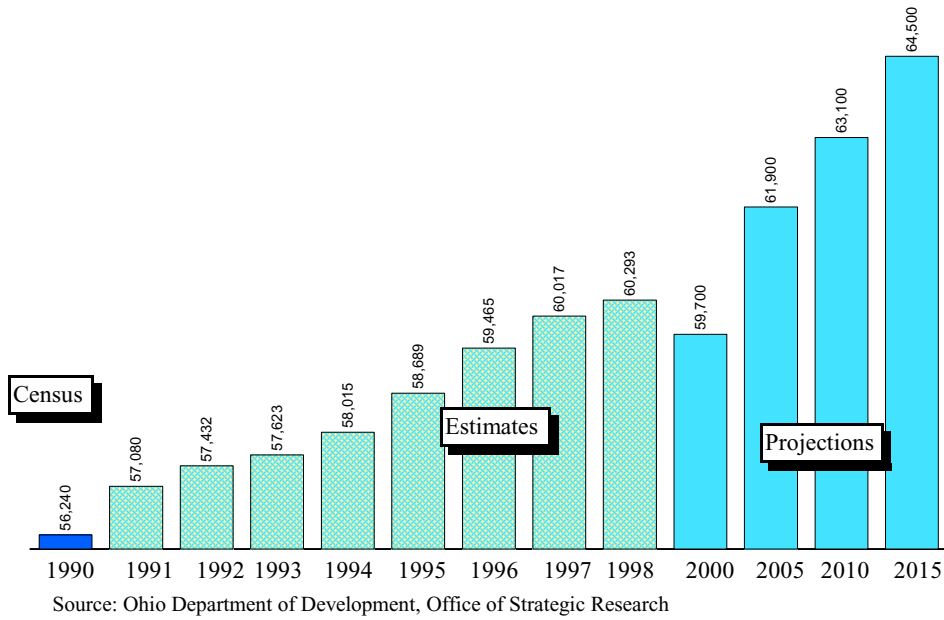

### Population 1860 to 1990 Percent Change from Previous Census



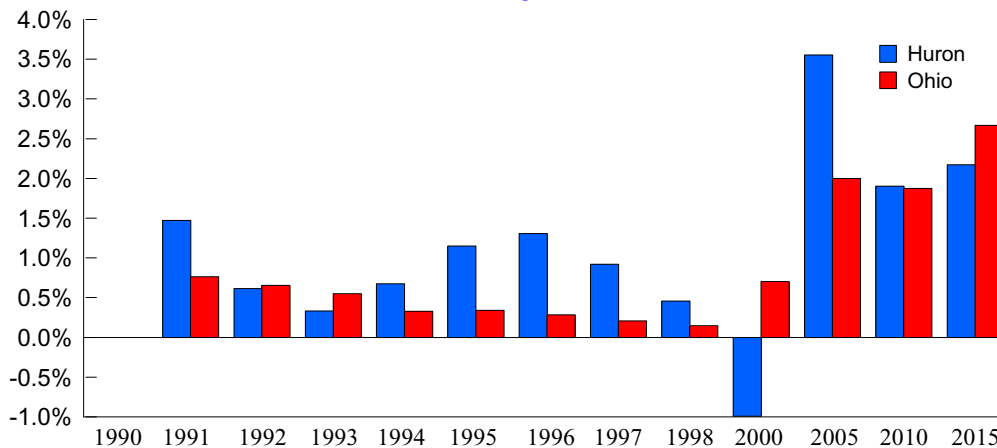

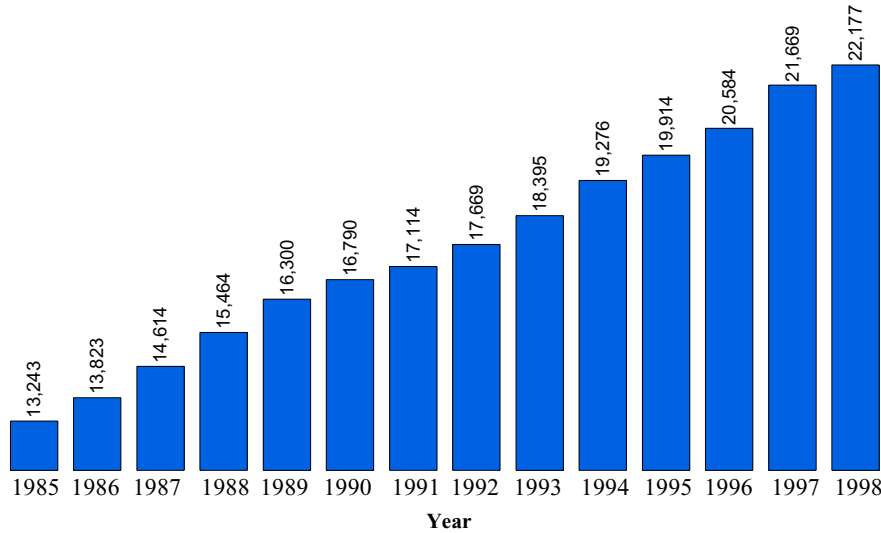

### Per Capita Personal Income



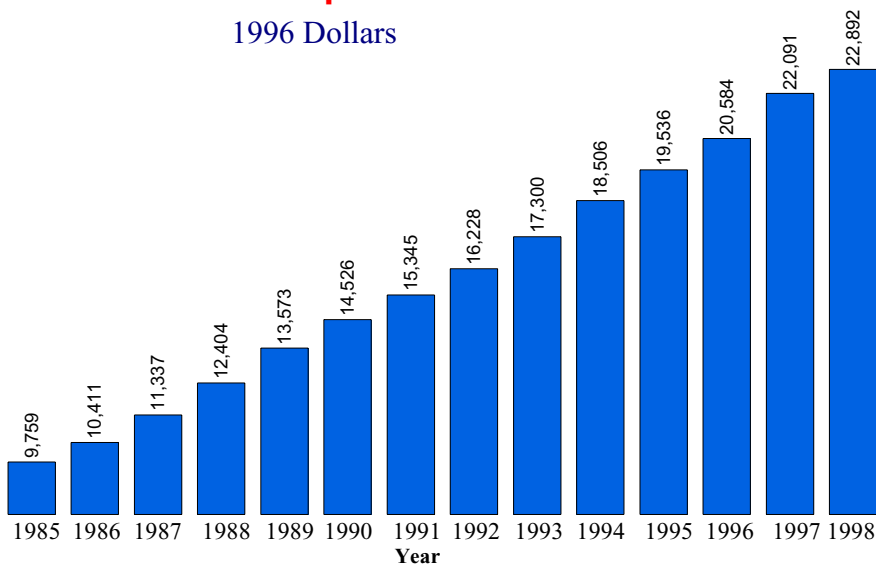
Per capita personal income is the amount of money before taxes generated on average by each person living in the county.

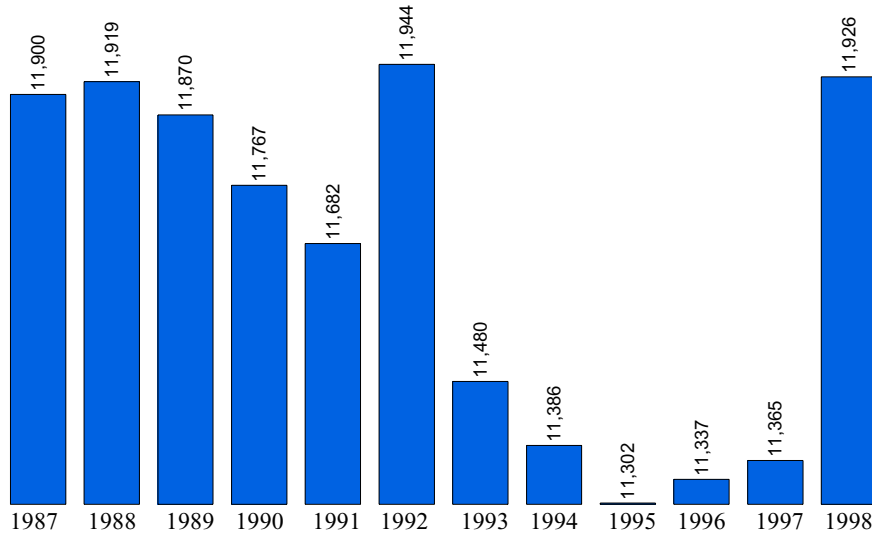

1998 Ohio Average Daily Membership = 1,846,903

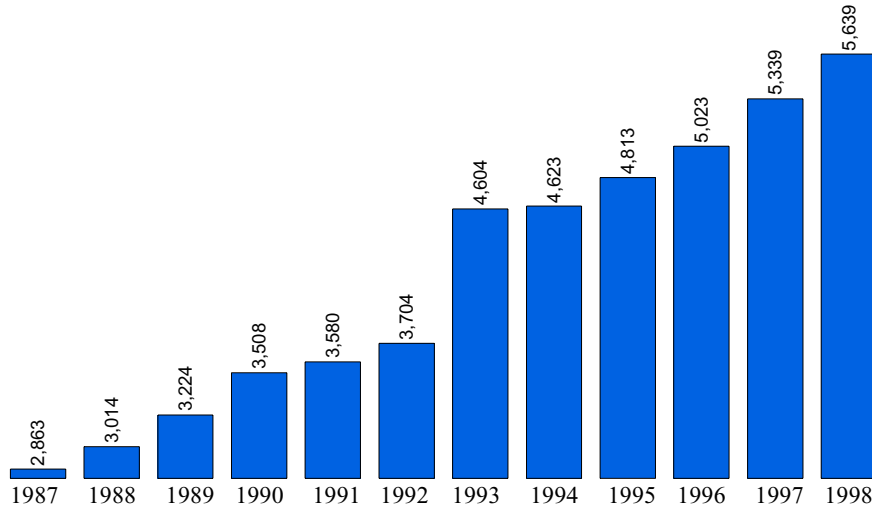

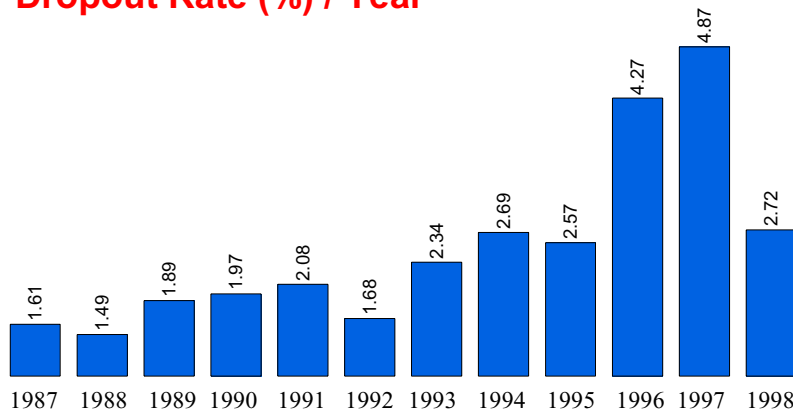

## Dropout Rate (%) / Year

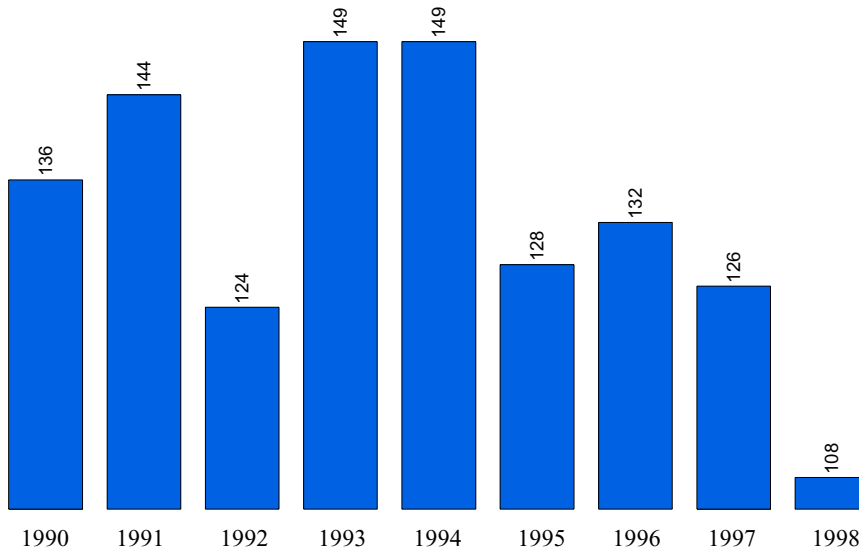

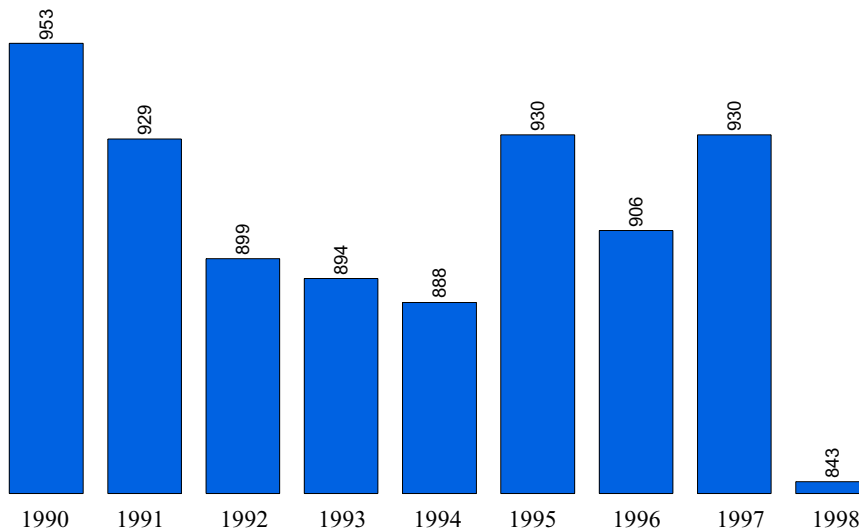

### Births to Mothers 19 and Under



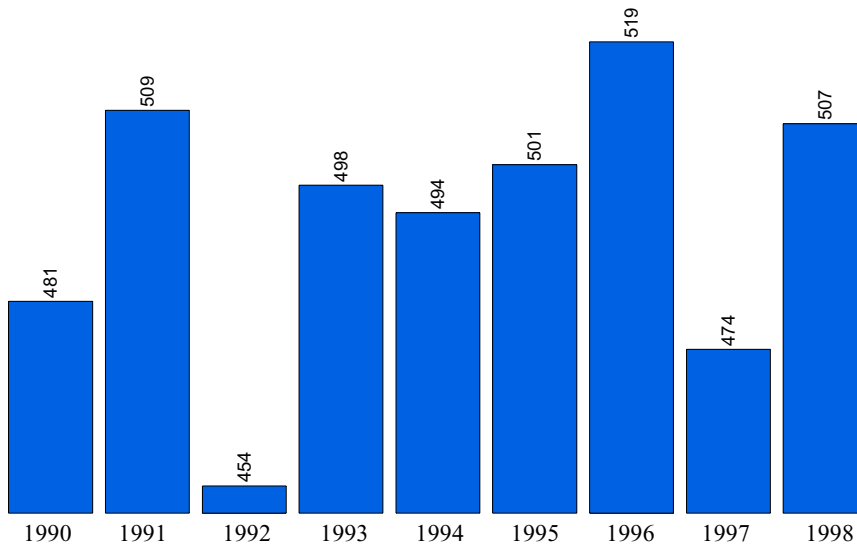

### Total County Births



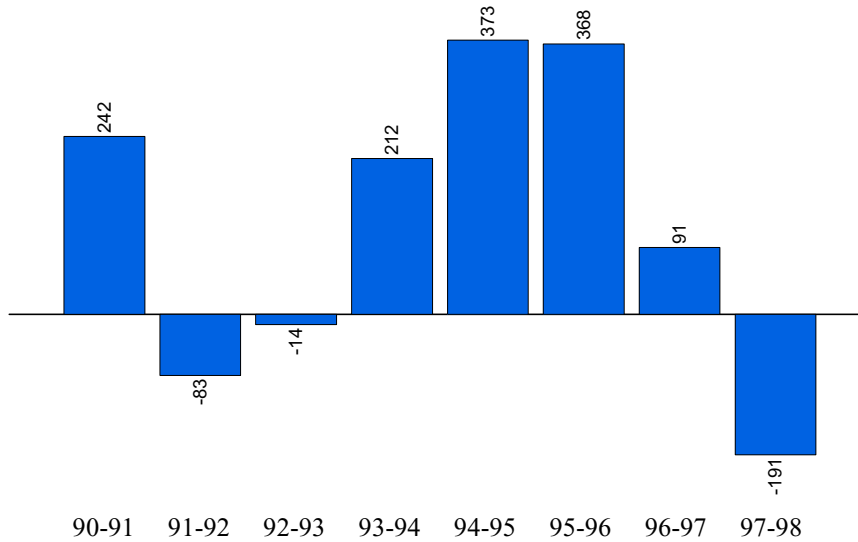
