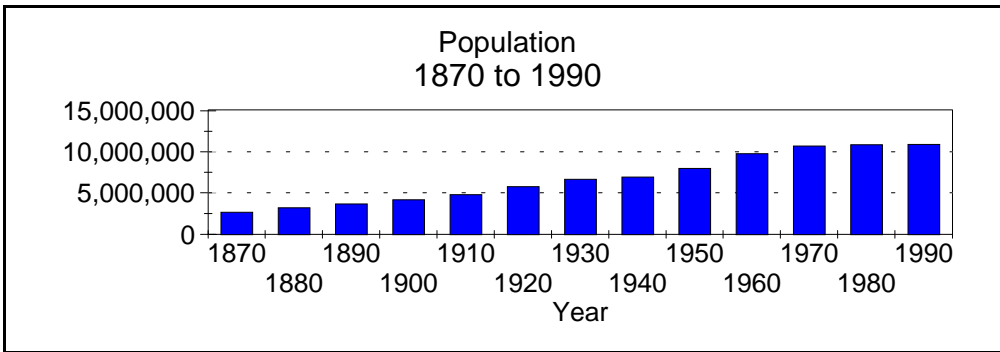

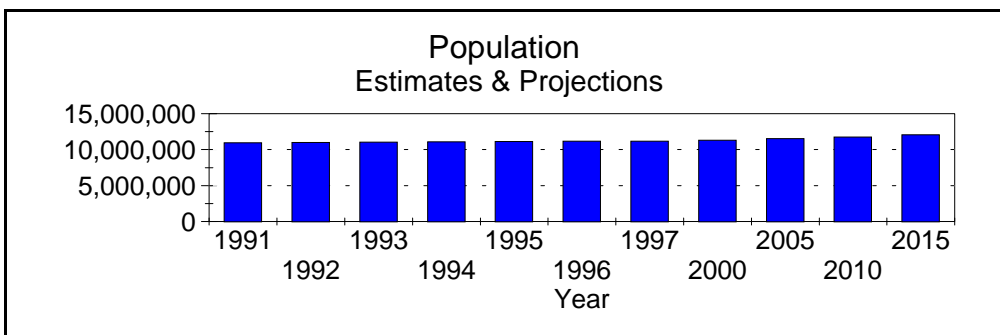

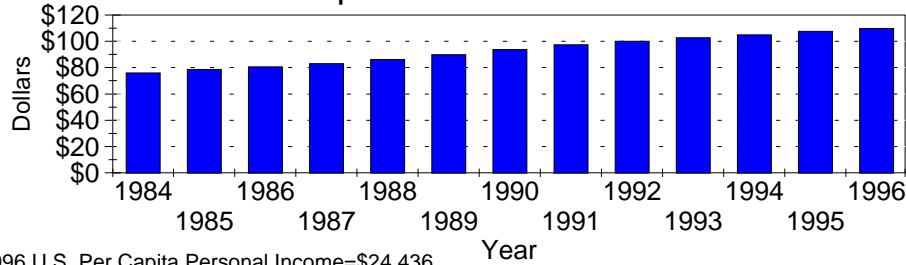

1996 U.S. Per Capita Personal Income=\$24,436

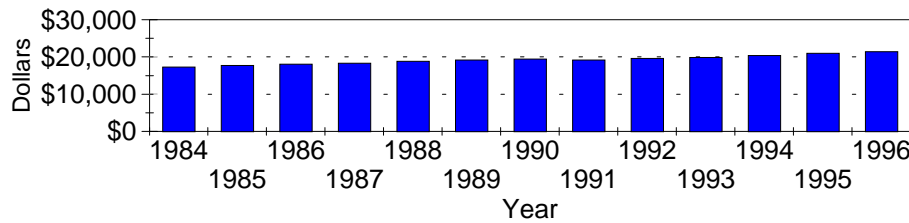
Per capita personal income is the amount of money before taxes generated on average by each person living in the county.

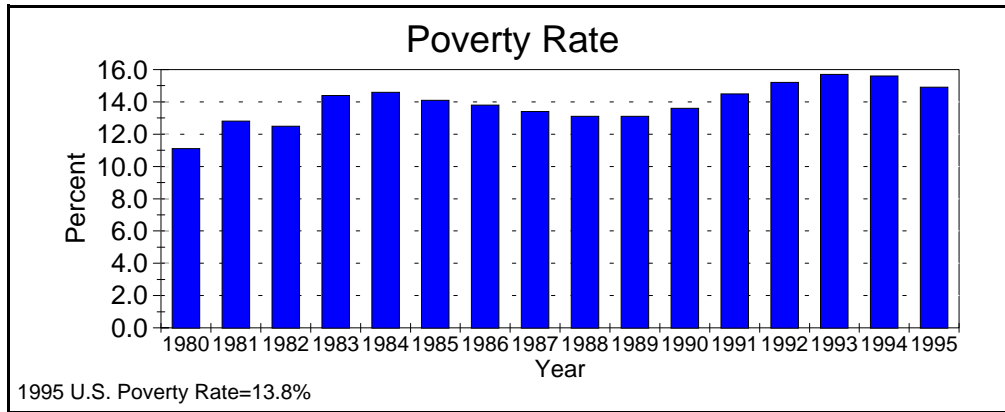

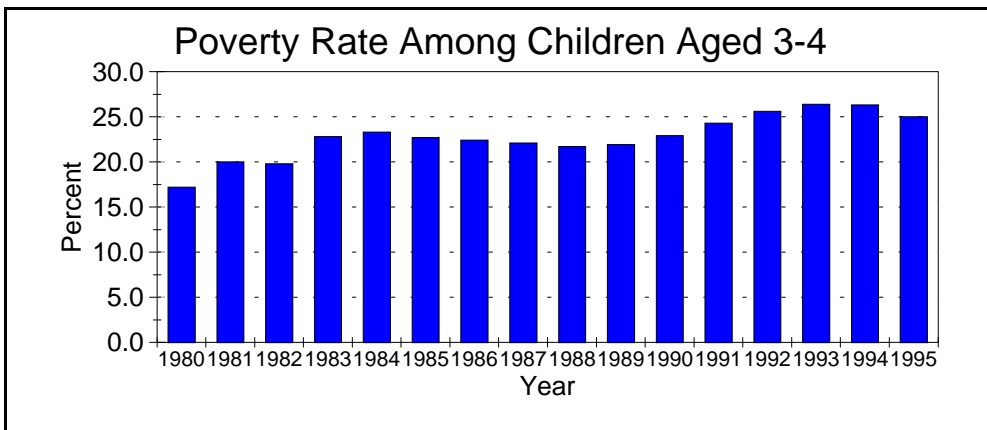

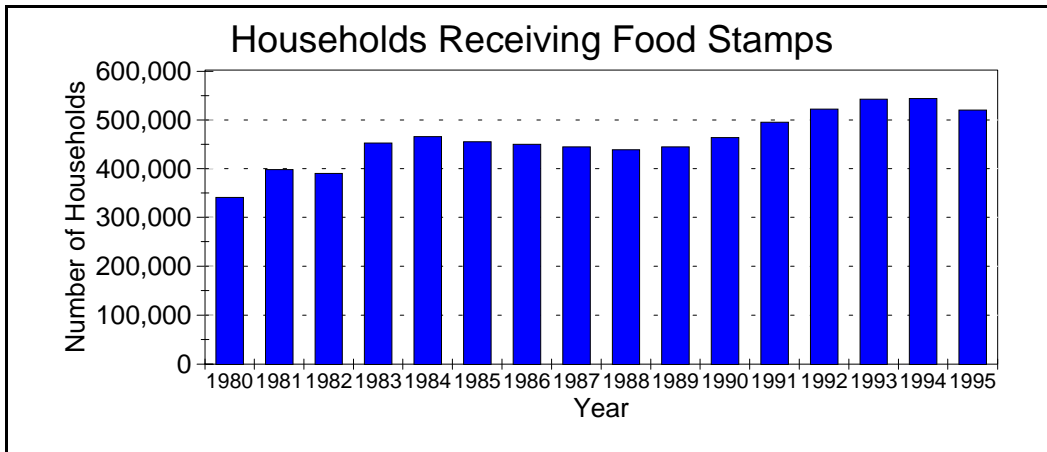

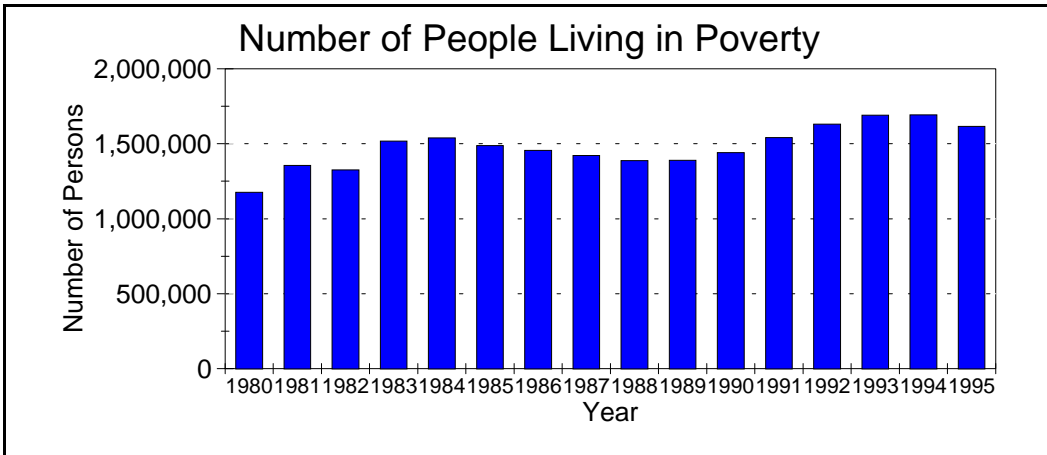

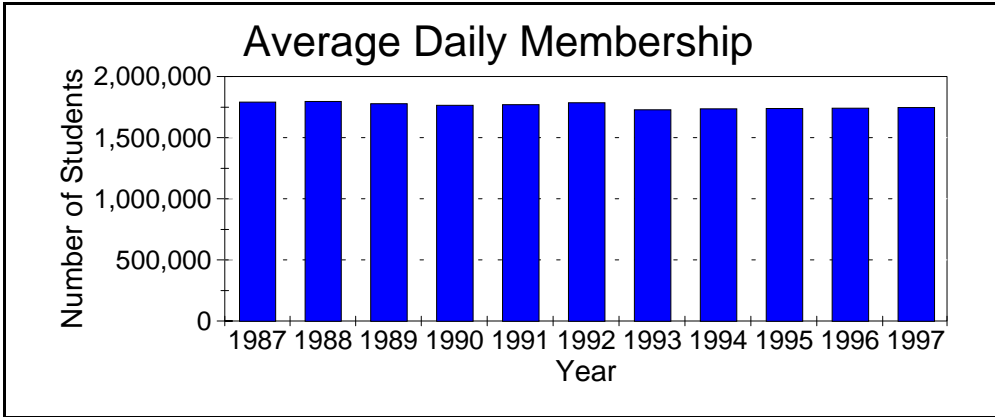

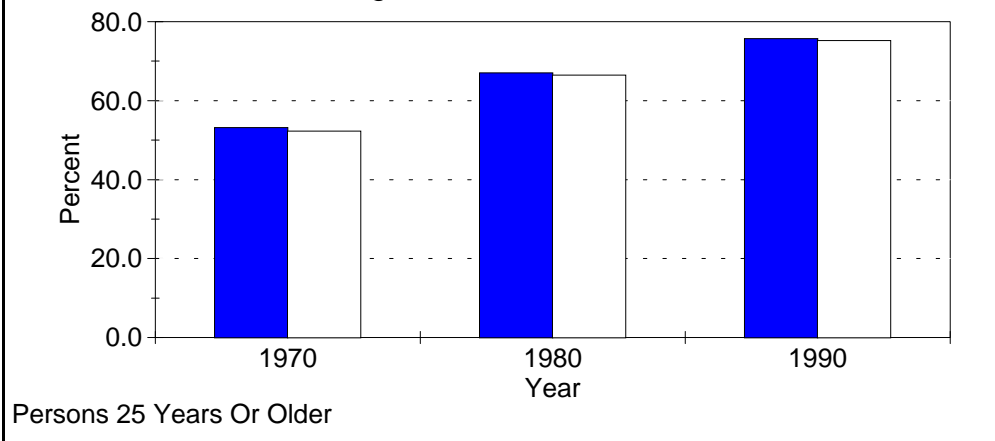

Percent High School Graduates

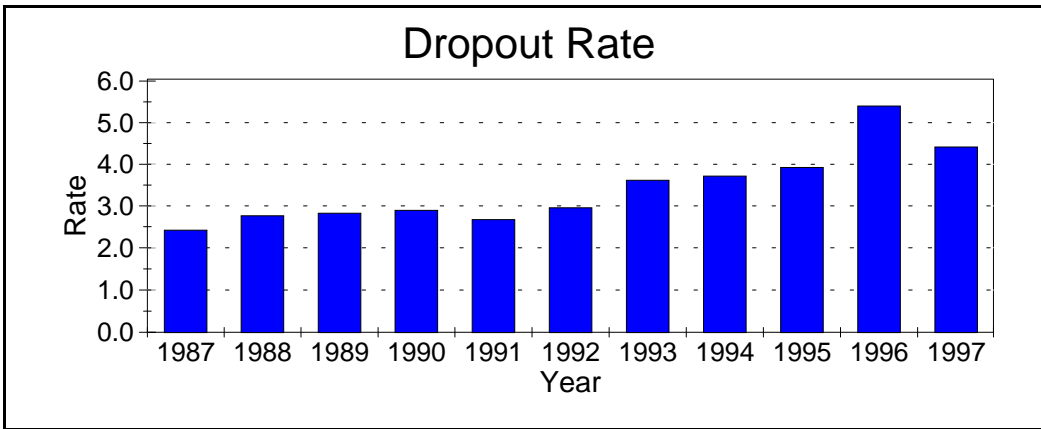

Dropout Rate

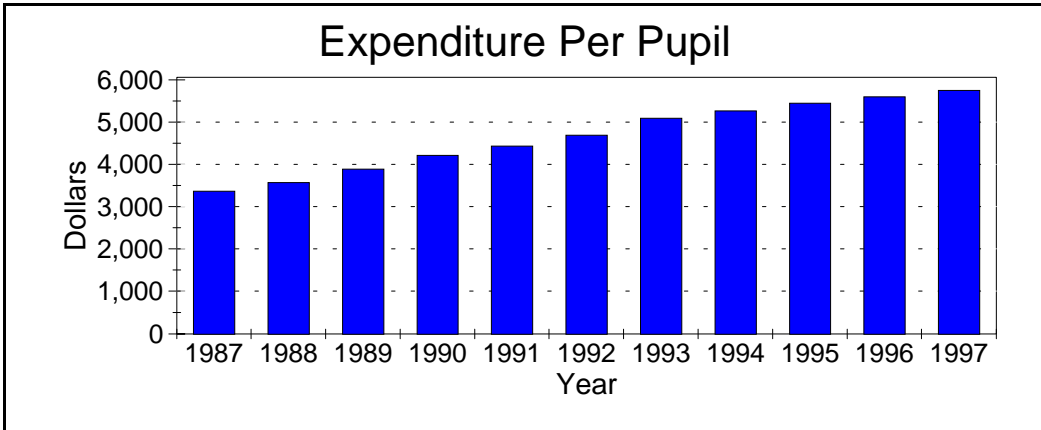
