

4-H Older Youth Opportunities

County Opportunities:

The opportunities listed below have no application form. Indicate your interests on the enclosed check list and we will add you to our mailing lists.

County Awareness Team - Members are ambassadors of 4-H, promote 4-H opportunities to 3rd graders and receive public speaking experience. Member cost: none (a few selected from each school district)

4-H Home Economics Committee - This group is made up of adults and youth to help direct and support clothing and food & nutrition activities such as fair, judgings, clinics and Style Review. Member cost: none (many selected)

Carteens - Members help teach teen traffic offenders about traffic safety. Members should be 14 and older and available mornings, the second Saturday of the month. Member cost: none (many selected)

4-H Committee - 4-H members serve two-year terms on the 4-H Committee. This committee of youth and adults make overall recommendations regarding Delaware County 4-H, select award and trip winners, and conduct fund raisers for 4-H programs, awards and recognition. (One member per school district selected each year)

If you are interested in being a Camp Counselor, CIT, Tech Team, or Junior Fair Board member; you must complete the appropriate application and return it by **Friday, January 7, 2005**. The applications are available to download on the Delaware County 4-H website in PDF format at <http://delaware.osu.edu/4-h>. Click on the "Members" link. If you do not have web access, please call or stop by the Extension office to receive a hard copy.

Junior Camp Counselor or Counselor In Training - See the enclosed job description for qualifications. CIT's should be 15 by camp and camp counselors must be 16 by camp. Counselor cost: \$75.00 for counselors; \$85.00 for CIT's. 28 females and 16 males selected. Camp dates are July 21-25.

Junior Fair Board Member - 4-H, FFA, or FCCLA members currently 8th grade and older help conduct shows and judgings at the Delaware County Fair. Fair dates are September 17-24, 2005.

Delaware County Tech Team - The team will develop and maintain the Delaware Co. 4-H website, support a database for the Delaware Co. Junior Fair and educate members and advisors in different areas of technology. For age 14 and older. Six to eight members will be selected.

The following trips and awards are selected by the 4-H Committee. Complete the Ohio 4-H Achievement Form, available to download on the Delaware County 4-H website in PDF format at <http://delaware.osu.edu/4-h>. Click on the "Members" link. If you do not have web access, please call or stop by the Extension office to receive a hard copy. The form needs to only include 2004 information if you are not applying for a state level opportunity. The form is due **Friday, January 7, 2005** for the activities listed below. For all of these opportunities, full-time participation is required. If you cannot attend 100% of the time, please wait to apply another year when your schedule permits full-time participation.

- May receive only once. Previous winners not eligible.
- 4-H Conservation Camp - A six day camp (July 25-30) held at Camp Ohio, Utica. Primarily designed for youth interested in Environmental Sciences. Participants learn by doing, using Camp Ohio as their laboratory. Participants can be 4-H age 13 and older. Member cost: \$50.00 (1 to 2 selected)
- 4-H Leadership Camp - A six day camp (July 25-30) held at Camp Ohio, Utica. This program focuses on helping youth develop leadership by actually planning, conducting, and evaluating major parts of the camp program. Member should be at least 14 years old for this camp. Member cost: none (2 selected)

- 4-H Citizenship Washington Focus - This one week program (June 26 - July 2) is held in our nation's capitol, Washington D.C., and focuses on citizenship. Participants should be age 15 and older. Member cost: \$100.00 (1 to 2 selected)
- Ohio Forestry Camp - This six day camp (June ??-??) is held at FFA Camp Muskingum, Leesville Lake, Carroll County. The program focuses on tree identification, silviculture, ecology and forest products. We will forward your name on to Delaware County Soil & Water Conservation District, who makes the selections.
- 4-H Sea Camp - Experience marine biology first-hand at Kelleys Island 4-H Camp on Lake Erie. Camp is July, exact dates to be announced in January 2005. Fishing, ecology, marine navigation, snorkeling, SCUBA, sailing and much more. Participants must be 4-H age 13 and older. Member cost: \$75.00 (1 to 2 selected). Others may register, but must pay full cost, price to be determined (2003 cost was \$350.00).
- Buckeye Leadership Workshop - Learn recreational leadership skills at this outstanding event (April 1-6) held at Recreation Unlimited in Ashley, Ohio. Participants must be age 16 and older. Member cost: \$75.00 (1 to 2 selected). Others may register, but must pay full cost of \$350.00.
- State 4-H Shooting Sports Education Camp - Improve your level of shooting in a major discipline and sample several other disciplines. Held at Canter's Cave 4-H Camp in Jackson, Ohio (July 31- Aug. 5). Camp is open to all youth age 12 to 16. Member cost: \$50.00 (1 to 2 selected). Others may register, but must pay full cost - was \$225.00 in 2004.

♣ Requires completion of separate, specialized application form. 4-H Achievement Record not required for eligibility.

- * State Junior Fair Board - Is made up of representatives from several different youth organizations in Ohio including 4-H Youth Development. State Junior Fair Board members help strengthen and coordinate State Fair activities in a fast-paced month at the Ohio State Fair. Members are expected to attend meetings and stay the entire fair and serve a two-year term. The Ohio State Fair is August 3-14, 2005.
- * National 4-H Dairy Conference - This national event provides delegates with an opportunity to learn more about the dairy industry and observe new dairy industry developments. The conference is tentatively scheduled at the University of Wisconsin in Madison, Wisconsin from October 2-5, 2005.
- * Ohio Dairy Goat Conference - This conference provides delegates with the opportunity to learn more about the dairy goat industry and observe new dairy goat industry practices. The conference is tentatively scheduled to be held at the Ohio State University in Columbus, Ohio sometime in September/October, 2005.
- * OTA Local Government Award - Two \$1500 awards are available to 4-H high school seniors who has completed a local government-type activity that has had significant impact on the applicant's community, township or county.

- * State Achievement Awards - These 19 awards recognize a 4-H member's achievement in a specific area. Areas include: Beef, Citizenship & Community Service, Clothing & Textiles, Dairy, Dairy Goat, Environmental Sciences, Family Life & Child Development, Foods & Nutrition, Gardening & Horticulture, Health & Safety, Horse, Leadership, Mechanical & Engineering Sciences, Personal Development, Rabbits & Poultry, Sheep, Shooting Sports, Swine and Veterinary Science. Each achievement award winner will receive a trip to the National 4-H Congress, scheduled in Atlanta, Georgia from November 25-29, 2005.

- ♣ Ohio 4-H Scholarships - There are 24 state 4-H scholarships available in 2005 and each has its own list of eligibility requirements. Please request a "Ohio 4-H Scholarship Application Form" from your County Agent. The state 4-H scholarship application form gives a complete listing of each scholarship and its requirements.

- ♣ Ohio 4-H Ambassador - Each year, delegates are selected from each county to serve a one year term as a State 4-H Ambassador. Ambassadors are selected based on their accomplishments in leadership, public speaking, and community service and are required to attend a training in Columbus. Ambassadors represent Ohio's 4-H youth at various state and local events. Completion of an Ohio 4-H Achievement Record is not necessary to be eligible for this award/opportunity. A separate form must be completed.

- ♣ International Programs - These programs allow 4-H'ers and alumni ages 14-30 to serve as a host to a youth from another country or to travel abroad as a 4-H representative to more than 30 countries around the world. Some scholarships are available for travel. Completion of an Ohio 4-H Achievement Record is not necessary to be eligible for these opportunities. Instead, a separate, specialized application form is required.
